

Welcome to the 2020 camping season, we are happy you will be joining us.

Oak Park Kampground management and staff are super excited to welcome everyone back for the 2020 camping season it should be a great season for all of us if we do it right.

Doing what we can to help mitigate risk for the Covid-19 virus for our staff and guests is of utmost importance to us. Therefore, we have created the following plan and procedures. Anyone who does not follow these rules and procedures will be asked to leave the park without refund.

If you are feeling sick or have been exposed to someone who is sick or has been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days, please stay home.

Face covering are now required when coming into the store, using the bathroom or when you need to be closer than 6' to someone outside. Thank you.

- If you have a bathroom in you camper you must use it, as **our restrooms are only open Thursday thru Sunday and only for our guests in pop ups and tents** so that there are fewer people using them and they can practice social distancing.
- The pool capacity must stay at 50% therefor we will have guests reserve a time slot to use it. You can call the office in the morning to reserve a time for that day, with you site # and amount of people then we will let you know if it is available. You will also need to bring your own chairs to the pool. Pool hours will be 10 am until 8:30 pm. It will be closed at noon and 3:15 pm for touch surfaces sanitizing.
- Pedal Boats are also by appointment, please bring your own life jackets. The pedal boats can be reserved for a time slot from the time the store opens until 7:30 pm. Playground is open, use at your own risk as it is not sanitized. It will close at 9 am and 3 pm to be spritzed with cleaner.
- Please do not walk through other people's sites, this is proper etiquette always, however even more so now as some folks really do worry about the virus. Please remind your children as well.
- Please wear a face covering whenever there is direct contact with others and regular 6-foot distancing is not practical. Some activities may require the wearing of a face covering.
- Children may ride bikes, however please by sure they are riding only on the roads and not through the sites or on the grass and that they are obeying the 5-mph speed limit.
- Day visitors are charged a fee of \$3 pp or \$5 pp on holiday weekends. Day visitors will be limited to 4 people at any one time and the number of total people on your site may not exceed 10 at any time (unless several sites are rented), all visitors must exit the park by 9:30 pm and park in the front parking lot. If you have a larger group, we do have an area you can use, however the group may not exceed 25.
- All campers must go on the pad, in the direction shown on the map. We can no longer allow any unit to go into the site in the opposite direction.
- All people who will be staying overnight **MUST BE REGISTERED** when you provide us with the reservation information.
- Our campsites are 40' wide. Many sites have electric boxes and water hydrants on every other site; therefore, you must run the utilities underneath your camper. Please plan accordingly and bring extra hose and an 30amp extension cord incase you are on one of these sites, as we cannot lend out hoses or cords for you to borrow during your stay. We do sell both hoses and 30amp extension cords in the camp store.
- All organized activities will be done with social distancing. Please bring scissors, glue, tape, markers, and crayons with you as we will have a craft kit for you to do at your site. .

- The store will be open to one family at a time, or you can also call us and if we have the item you need, we can drop it off at your site and add it to your bill.
- Our Laundry room will be by appointment only, as only one person/family can be in there at a time. We have 2 washers (2.00 each load) and 2 dryers (2.50 each load). Please call or text the office to set up a time for your family to use it. It will be cleaned after each use.
- Please wear a face covering whenever there is direct contact with others and regular 6-foot distancing is not practical. Some activities may require the wearing of a face covering.
- Max number of registered guests at your site is 6 including both kids and adults. Max # of people on your site is 10 unless you have several sites together and then no more than 25 and only if it allows social distancing and does not interfere with other campers
- Practice social distancing. Be sure you stay at least 6 feet away from other guests when enjoying the open spaces and nature trails.
- Please wash your hands often especially when touching shared surfaces. When washing hands please do so for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. When soap and water are not available please use one of our hand sanitizing stations.
- Children under the age of 6 must be accompanied by an adult when off their campsite
- Create a family plan to help with social distancing.
- While walking the family pet, please ask before allowing your dog to socialize with other dogs. Please walk them in an area where it is easy to keep them social distance and as always on a **6' leash** that is in your hand and pick up after them while maintaining the 6-foot rule.
- Please leave the garbage open so that guests can just toss their trash in the dumpster without having to open it. Dumpster will be opened at 8 am and closed at 8 pm. If you need to use the dumpster at other times or if it is raining, please remember to wash your hands after touching.
- Always remember to wash your hands after using the dump station.

Check In

- CHECK IN will ONLY be during the hours of 1-9 p.m. If you will be later than 9 p.m. prior arrangements must be made. Check out is by Noon.
- When you arrive, we will welcome you in the main driveway, if you filled out your online check in form electronically, you can stay in your vehicle and someone will meet you. If you did not do the online Check in waiver form then you can come to the office and register. We do clean the picnic table, pedestal, and spigot when turning over sites, however it is still good practice to wash your hands after hooking up and unhooking utilities.

Check Out

- As in the past, you will settle any charges with us at the end of your stay. The morning of your departure we will email you an invoice and you can call the office with a CC to pay your bill. if you do not have access to email or you want to pay in cash, you can stop at the office to pay before leaving.

This new normal is going to take some getting used to, we hope that as the summer goes on the Governor will loosen even more of the restrictions.
